

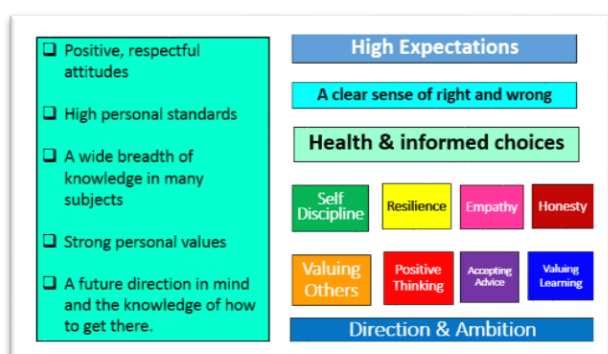

Fidget Spinners

Recently, we have noticed a rapid increase in the volume of students who have a fidget spinner.
