Thursday 12 October Friday 13 October




Visits will be strictly by appointment only so please contact our Admissions Officer, Sue Ford, to book onto one of these mornings.

## **Parent Parking**

Our local residents are excellent neighbours and are very supportive of the school.

In turn, I would be grateful if our parent community could be respectful of our neighbours and ensure that all parking on Woodside Road is safe and legal. A neighbour recently wrote to us as follows:

"I have found myself in gridlock today when trying to leave my home ...Unfortunately parents continue to block driveways whilst waiting for their children ..."

Our neighbours understand that there will be an increased volume of traffic on local streets at certain times of the day. They have requested that parents are reminded not to block driveways whilst waiting for their children to leave school or dropping them off at the beginning of the day.

## **Food Allergens**

The company that provides school lunches and general catering (Sodexo) have asked us to make parents aware that they are introducing an enhanced process to ensure that they can keep children who have food allergies safe.

Sodexo have informed us that if they do not have any medical evidence from a doctor or dietician regarding the allergy then Sodexo will only be able to offer a plain jacket potato to students who may have an allergy.

If your child suffers from food allergies and the company is already aware of the issue then Sodexo will write to parents directly to ensure they have accurate information from parents/carers before they can serve food from their full range to your child.

## **Y10 Options**

The vast majority of our Year 10 students are very happy with their option choices.

However, a very small number of students have approached Mrs Willis, the Vice Principal, requesting a change in options. A change will be considered if there is space in the new class and if the change is in the best interests of the student. In order to facilitate a change, a form (available from Mrs Willis) must be completed by teachers and parents. The final deadline for changes will be Friday 22 September. After that, changes will not be possible as students will have missed too much of the course to catch up.

## **Y9 Meningitis ACWY vaccinations**

All Year 9 students will shortly be receiving a letter and consent form regarding Meningitis vaccinations that are being offered in school on Tuesday 17 October.

On this occasion, Y9 students will also be offered the Diphtheria/Polio and Tetanus vaccination at the same time. Parents should sign and return the consent form to the Academy as soon as possible; it will not be possible to give a vaccination if we do not have a signed consent form. Please can we ask that all forms are returned, even if you are declining the offer of a vaccination.

Parents should be aware that this particular programme of vaccinations is NOT available from your GP so having it in school is the only way to ensure your child can be immunised.

## **Exciting opportunities in PE**

There are a few exciting opportunities available to students at JCA that we don't want you to miss out on.

- CLF Fencing Academy: From Friday 15 September, there will be an opportunity to join a fencing team. The coaching happens at BMA and students are transported over at the end of the school day. Posters are up in PE for more information. The course is free and will culminate in a competition against other schools.
- Netball and Rugby clubs are on for all year groups please see the clubs posters up around school.
- GCSE PE academic support is on a Monday and GCSE practical sport is on a Wednesday (this term doing badminton, table tennis and rock climbing).

**PE Kit**: We have already collected several ties, blazers and PE kit which has been misplaced without names in. Please can we ask again that parents put their children's names in all kit - SOCKS included! It will save you money.

**Bikeability**: This is a course for Year 7 students where they are taught how to ride a bike and be safe on the roads. JCA PE work in partnership with the local council to provide this facility to keep our children safe. Please can parents return the permission slips to Mr Wilson in the PE office. Students come out of PE for a couple of lessons during the year to get 1-2-1 or small group teaching.

**Open Evening**: There were 37 students who volunteered to stay behind school for over 4 hours to take part in the open evening events. The students did gymnastics, table tennis, badminton, football, basketball and bench ball. The behaviour was simply exemplary. Effort levels were incredible and so many students led the Year 6s to have a go at some of the PE activities on offer. All the PE department were very proud of them and how they represented the Academy! Well done!
